1. After due enquiry, I am satisfied that:

**SECTION VI - TRANSPORT**

1. Animals traveling by air must be carried in an approved container which meets the standards set out by IATA.
2. All documents must be affixed to the container.
3. If traveling through a prohibited country or territory<sup>7</sup>, the door of the container has been sealed in Canada, with a government approved seal, before the animal was loaded onto the aircraft.

NOTES:

1. The microchip number must be recorded on all documentation required for the importation of your dog or cat.
2. Microchips implanted on or after March 1, 2019 must be ISO-compliant (15-digit, numerical). Microchips implanted before March 1, 2019 must be ISO-compatible (10 or more alphanumeric characters). Proof of the date of implant is required.
3. Rabies vaccination must occur after microchip implantation and be carried out as per the guidelines in Appendix VI of the Conditions Governing the Importation of Dogs and Cats into the Cayman Islands, The Animals Law (2015 Revision).
4. The list of laboratories approved by the Cayman Islands can be found in Appendix III of the Conditions Governing the Importation of Dogs and Cats into the Cayman Islands, The Animals Law (2015 Revision).
5. Canada is considered by the Cayman Islands to be a 'low' rabies-risk territory. Following a successful titre, animals must wait a minimum of two (2) months before being eligible for export.
6. Approved active ingredients include fipronil, amitraz, pyrethrins, permethrins and isoxazolines. Shampoos, collars, and preparations licensed for the control of only fleas (e.g. Program, Advantage, Revolution and Sentinel) are not acceptable.
7. The list of prohibited countries and territories can be found in Section D.1 of the Conditions Governing the Importation of Dogs and Cats into the Cayman Islands, The Animals Law (2015 Revision).
